PENNANT REPORT

BOARD MEETING – 19 Feb 24

Since Christmas the Pennant Committee has been busy preparing for the Finals.

We have had a very fortunate summer with any heatwaves having limited impact on our Pennant competition.

Following are a number of Pennant administrative updates:

- **Weekend Pennant Division A1 Round 1.** An update on the Myrtleford v YMGCR saga has now been resolved due to the appeal by YMGCR to the Bowls Victoria Board not being successful.
 - The results of the Round 1 game has been adjusted and points awarded to Myrtleford. Fortunately, this action had very little impact on YMGCR re Finals.
- Our Board may wish to gain feedback from Regions throughout Victoria, at the next BVRR meeting, on whether they feel that they are losing autonomy in running their Pennant Competitions (Bowls Vic advise that it is their competition not the Regions).

Update on NSW Clubs Transferring to Victoria. The latest news on NSW border clubs:

- As you are aware Commercial Club has voted to apply to transfer to Victoria. No formal application will be submitted by them until they complete their current Pennant season and some of their members have played off in State finals.
- North Albury will be meeting sometime next week to discuss whether they will submit an application to transfer to Victoria. The current situation is that 2/3rds of their members wish to transfer but are being held back by their current president/Bowls Committee.
- There is a strong rumor that Culcairn, Walla, Holbrook and Rand are considering their options due to the weekend competition due to the move by Holbrook, Lavington and Commercial Club.

Pennant Finals Venue Options.

- This season we are in a position that most of the individual Divisions can play at the same venue eg. Weekend A1 both elimination and qualifying Sides playing at Rutherglen.
- In the Weekend Qualifying Final Corryong and Tallangatta will play at Corryong due to both having the same Greens surface and providing a request to do so.

Regional Representatives. For the Grand finals (Weekend and Midweek) we will require a Regional Representative at each venue to present plaques and medallions. It is hoped that a member of the Board can perform this function. Venues etc will be advised at the completion of the Preliminary Finals.

O & M BOWLS REGION

Suggested Club and Pennant Structure for Season 2024-25 and beyond.

With continual changes to lawn bowls across Australia and especially in regional areas the need for change is necessary to continue to grow and develop our great sport.

The current structure of pennant bowls in the O & M region needs to be changed from its current format and bring it in to line with other Victorian Regions. To my knowledge the O & M is the only Victorian region that has weekend pennant divisions of A1, A2, A3 and A4 that have promotion and relegation and then divisions of B1, B2, B3 and B4, that are geographically arranged (to suit just a few clubs that do not wish to travel or be promoted) and not arranged according to club pennant results or player ability. Midweek pennant is also similar in structure.

Our O & M Region, like many other regions in Victoria, covers a large geographical area and needs to be divided into two playing areas to help reduce the distance and travel times for competing clubs. (For example the distance between Mansfield and Corryong is 294 kms and involves more than three hours of travel time by car.)

It is not necessary for the two playing areas to be similar or equal in the number of clubs in each area.

Over the last couple of years new clubs have joined our O & M region and more are expected to and will continue to join our region in the future. Unfortunately we will also possibly lose some clubs in the future due to lack of club members or other reasons.

The O & M therefore needs to be flexible in its Pennant Structure to be fair to all clubs and players and provide opportunity for all clubs and players.

The following is my thoughts for consideration only and not necessarily the perfect solution.

1. Divide our region into two Playing Areas - O & M East and O & M West.
2. Establish an O & M Premier Division consisting of eight teams for both weekend and midweek pennant.
3. The West Playing Area to have five (5) divisions for weekend pennant and three (3) divisions for midweek pennant.
4. The East Playing Area to have three (3) divisions for weekend pennant two (2) divisions for midweek pennant.

5. Weekend pennant Divisions 1 and 2 to consist of 8 clubs in each with 4 teams (16 players) and Division 3 and 4 to consist of 8 clubs with 3 teams (12 players) and Division 5 to consist of remaining clubs with 3 teams (12 players) if possible.
6. Midweek pennant Divisions 1 and 2 to consist of 8 clubs in each with 3 teams (12 players) and Division 3 to consist of remaining clubs with 3 teams (12 players) if possible.
7. The Final Series for both weekend and midweek pennant to remain in the current format for all Divisions.
8. The grand final winners in Premier Division for both weekend and midweek pennant proceed to represent the O & M at the Victorian Champions of State Pennant.
9. Promotion and relegation for all divisions in weekend and midweek pennant at the completion of the pennant season as follows:
 - (a) The bottom 2 sides in Premier Division are relegated to Division 1 in their respective playing areas.
 - (b) The grand final winners in Division 1 for each Playing Area promoted to Premier Division.
 - (c) The grand final winners in all other divisions promoted to their higher division.
 - (d) The bottom sides in all other divisions, except the bottom divisions, to be relegated to the lower division.
9. If a club winning a grand final already has a team in the relevant higher division then the runner up is promoted. No club to have more than one team in any division.
10. It may be necessary for clubs such as Wodonga to have more than one team in the lowest relevant division.

(See below for a more detailed and suggested club and pennant structure)

Advantages of Restructure:

- The concept of a Pennant Competition is to determine who the best team or Champion is in that competition and as such should be rewarded for their success.
- The dividing of our O & M Region into 2 Playing Areas with Divisions allows for all clubs and players to be rewarded for winning a Grand Final.
- Promotion to the next highest division is that reward for both the respective club and the players.
- The structure of having 2 Playing Areas eliminates the possibility of clubs having to travel long distances for pennant games.
